Kanata Golf Course Redevelopment Update:

Barbara Ramsay (Chair of the Kanata Greenspace Protection Coalition) gave an update on the issues that are of concern at the moment, specifically:

- Status of legal appeal process round 2
- Appreciation of the community financial support, which has ensured we have the funds to continue the effort
- Status of MPP Karen McCrimmon's private member bill regarding the importance of stormwater management

Western Ottawa Community Resource Centre:

- Published Tree Inventory Report with emphasis on the Eco-services of trees

2024 Season Plan

- Tree inventory training course May, followed by door-to-door data collection
- CAFES Workshops: Trees and Greenspace Caucus; Homes and Energy; Water and Gardens
- · Provide input to City Forestry's Varley Park tree planting
- Continue removal of targeted invasive plants in Beaverbrook parks
- · Host a green lecture e.g. biodiversity
- Partner with Carleton University Env. Sci. students fall semester
- Re-survey a previously inventoried street
