Home Energy

Food: Community Gardens

- I would not recommend trying to start a community garden unless one has ownership of the land with a source of water. Community Gardens can take 2-3 years to get going. Much better to join an existing one!

- Just Food runs the Ottawa Community Garden Network. They offer support and workshops for Community Gardens in Ottawa. They also have workshops and information for backyard gardeners.

Food: Local Farmers

- Kanata Farmers Market Starts May 6, runs every Saturday until October 28th 9 am to 3 pm
- Residents can sign up for a basket of fresh produce (Community Supported Agriculture CSA)
- Beet Box Farm is in the Green Belt along Carling Avenue
- Heart Beet Farms might be running a farm stand again this year in the Beaverbrook Centre.
 - At the Beaverbrook Mall (Centre) every Wednesday from July to December with our CSA baskets and online orders
- More CSAs are available here
- The <u>Good Food Box</u> was delivering out of the KBCA Community Centre but are primarily available from Merivale Road, & Downtown, possibly as there are several local weekend markets, including the Carp market

Transportation
